

# Why is this important?

MILLIONS OF ELIGIBLE U.S. VOTERS LIVE, WORK, OR SERVE AWAY FROM THEIR HOME STATE.

AMERICAN CITIZENS CAN VOTE IN THEIR HOME STATE NO MATTER WHERE THEY ARE.

THESE VOTES CAN MAKE THE DIFFERENCE IN ELECTIONS BOTH LOCAL AND STATEWIDE.

YOU PROBABLY KNOW SOMEONE WHO CAN VOTE AWAY FROM HOME.

REACH OUT TO THESE VOTERS YOU KNOW AND ASK THEM TO SEND THEIR VOTES HOME.



# THE CONVERSATION




Make a commitment to be intentional and reach out to each person on your list.


Your ask is non-partisan. Tell them they can send their vote home. Ask them to vote.

If they do not know how to vote while away, say "Let's look that up together."

Then make a commitment with yourself to reach out to them again. Follow up and ask them if they send their vote home yet.

## Your job is to **INVITE, ENCOURAGE, INFORM, CONFIRM:**

**\*Invite - “Are you ready to vote?” “Have you sent your vote home yet?”**

**\*Encourage - “Your vote matters.” “It’s easy, important.” (Not partisan.)**

**\*Inform - “You can request your ballot now.” Set a plan together.**

Military families serving away from their home state, in the US or abroad, should go to **fvap.gov** to register or request a ballot. (Federal law sets special voting provisions and timelines for military personnel stationed outside their voting jurisdiction—as well as their families.)

Civilians living overseas should go to **votefromabroad.org** to register or request a ballot. Military families serving overseas (but not in the US) can also go to this site.

People who are simply temporarily away from their voting location should follow their jurisdiction’s absentee voting rules. (Local election offices are listed here: <https://www.fvap.gov/search-offices>)

These are the three most important sites to share with your friends. Bookmark them and keep them ready.

There are state-by-state guides available at FVAP.gov and Votefromabroad.org - and authoritative answers to almost every possible question. It is a huge help to get people to the right place!

Overseas and military voters can usually vote electronically. This varies by state. So do dates. Consult the guides at the two sites above for authoritative answers. (No need to hunt.)

Both sites also have real-time help-desks and multiple language options.

**\*Confirm - “Have you sent your ballot home? Was it received?”**

***It is crucial to follow up.*** Make contact and specifically confirm that your friend has received and returned the ballot. Help them through any problems, with information at the sites above.

\*Did they send their ballot home? Celebrate with them! This could be the first time they’ve ever sent their ballot home. And you helped them do it! Thank them!

\*Encourage them to reach out to their friends too. They are now crucial in reaching their own network. And they are priceless—because they have done it already!

\*Are your friends willing to reach out personally to other eligible voters in their network? Are they willing to write postcards? (We can give them customized addresses.)

\*Give them a copy of the form. *Keep the relational organizing going!* It’s one of the simplest and most important tools we have to mobilize voters.
