## **FVAP.GOV**

Military households can vote no matter where they serve--around the country or around the world. This site helps them do it.

Anyone can use the National Mail Voter Registration Form here. Available in over twenty languages. Ideal for recent movers. Absentees can find state election info.

US citizens don't lose their voting rights when they're outside the country. This site helps them vote--from anywhere.



# Voters Can Be Anywhere: How Many Can You Reach?

## **Friends and Family**

Friends temporarily out of state? A cousin in the Coast Guard? An old neighbor who lives in Toronto? **They can vote.**

## **Your Voice Is Powerful**

They're a lot more likely to vote if you ask them. Nothing moves someone to act like the voice of a friend or family member.

# Friend or Family in the Military? Ask Them to Vote

## **Voting Rights Protected**

People on active duty can vote no matter where they serve--around the country **OR** around the world. So can their families.

## **Special Absentee Ballots**

If away from home, they can ask for a Special Absentee Ballot. Open to Merchant Marine and all uniformed services.

They can register and request a ballot at this site. In-person help is available at most military installations (US or abroad).

## **Your Rights Are Protected**

You can vote no matter where you're stationed--in the US or abroad. So can your family. Register or update at [eac.gov](https://eac.gov).
